BRINGING THEM HOME

Two years is a long time to wait for something. Especially when that something is two precious sons. We first heard of New Hope Haiti Mission back in the spring of 2006. Looking back it is hard to believe all that God has done in our hearts since we first heard of this wonderful mission.

We were your usual suburban family with three kids plugging away at life- work, school, church, sports, and friends. And then we saw a picture of Jeff. We heard that Haiti was experiencing a lot of turmoil and unrest. The mission had decided to adopt out because of the instability there. We asked about the boy in the picture. We prayed. And prayed.

God led us to adopt Jeff and after a trip in October of 2006, we also were drawn to David.
Although the boys were not biologically related, they had a bond. It was a wonderful thing to witness and we knew they must remain brothers.

The process in Haiti for adoption can be trying and frustrating. Rules change, political leaders flex their muscles, and the inefficiency of third world governmental disorganization comes into play. But finally, after two years of waiting and praying, Jeff and David came home to Virginia on July 28, 2008.

The boys have adapted so well to their new family. We laugh at how "American" they have become in such a short time. They are doing well with their English although they still speak Creole with each other at home. Our bio children have welcomed them with such big open arms. Adoption is truly a miracle.

We want to say thank you to everyone who gives to NHHM. Our boys were fed, schooled, clothed and loved for 8 and 4 years because someone like you gave to this mission. Because of that investment, we see two children that were spared hardship and suffering that is so widespread in Haiti among their peers. We are also thankful for NHHM's missionaries & staff and all the hard work that went into loving our sons and the other children.

GIGI IS HOME IN KY

After more than 2 years of waiting, Chris and Lisa Wells brought Gigi home from Haiti. Gigi was brought to New Hope as a baby. She came home to Kentucky on December 11, 2008 just in time for Christmas.

"She is a wonderful blessing to our family and we are so thankful she is finally home," said Lisa.



Schooling

Twelve of our children are going outside of NHHM to school. We ask that you consider financial helping with their school fees, uniforms, and transportation.

The rest of the kids are taught in the house by our teachers, Mr. Lawrens and Miss Phara. Most of the children are receiving good grades. Learning in Haiti is quite different. Most of the material must be memorized and recited.

The children are learning from 7am- 1pm daily.

After a long wait for a visa, JC was able to visit the United States for the first time in November, 2008.
